
Salary Trends

Across all years of experience, CDAs earn more than noncertified assistants.

Certified Dental Assistants
with 1-2 years of experience
earn over \$5,000 more per year
than non-certified assistants.

Restorative dental assistants

Dental assistants who perform restorative functions have higher earnings.

Certified Dental Assistant (CDA)

- O Performs restorative functions: **\$27 per hour**
- Doesn't perform restorative functions: \$26 per hour

Dental assistant, not certified

- O Performs restorative functions: \$23 per hour
- O Doesn't perform restorative functions: \$22 per hour

Lead dental assistants

Lead dental assistants also have higher earnings.

Certified Dental Assistant (CDA)

- O Lead assistant: \$27.25 per hour
- O Not lead assistant: \$25 per hour

Dental assistant, not certified

- O Lead assistant: **\$24 per hour**
- O Not lead assistant: \$22 per hour

Salary and work setting

Dental assistants' wages can vary depending on location and workplace. In all settings, Certified Dental Assistants earn more than non-certified assistants.

Desired salary

What wages do dental assistants hope for? The difference between feeling fairly compensated and not is \$4 per hour.

Certified Dental Assistants say they feel fairly compensated at \$29 per hour. Dental assistants who are not certified report feeling satisfied with \$25 per hour.



Certified Dental Assistants' wages can vary depending on state.







Raises

Nearly half of all dental assistants received a raise in the last 12 months. Most raises were 1-3%.








Satisfaction

THE TOP 3 FACTORS THAT IMPACT DENTAL ASSISTANT JOB SATISFACTION ARE:








Dental assistants who earn higher wages are more likely to report high job satisfaction.



Among dental assistants with less than 2 years of experience, nearly half said they planned to stay in dental assisting for more than 5 years. About one-quarter were not sure how long they would stay in the field.

Higher pay was the biggest factor in dental assistants staying in the profession.

The most common benefits dental assistants receive are paid time off, paid holidays, retirement savings plan, dental care, and health insurance.



About the survey

DANB's 2024 Dental Assistants Salary and Satisfaction Survey was conducted in May 2024. The findings in this report are based on a 6% total response rate from survey invitations sent to nearly 50,000 dental assistants. Survey researchers consider this response rate sufficient to generalize the results to the dental assistant population. Salary figures are reported as the median response (the median is the point in a data set at which about 50% of the responses fall above and 50% fall below). Salary figures are reported as hourly wages, without including the dollar value of any employee benefits. DANB has conducted a salary survey every two years since 2004. The consistency of data over these years supports the conclusion that these results are representative of the population.
